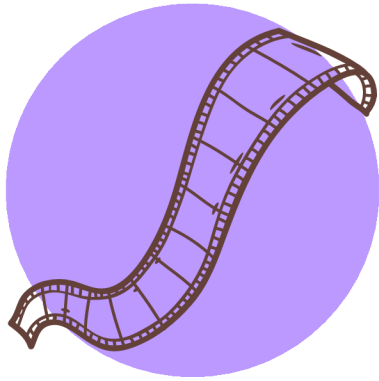
OUTCOMES

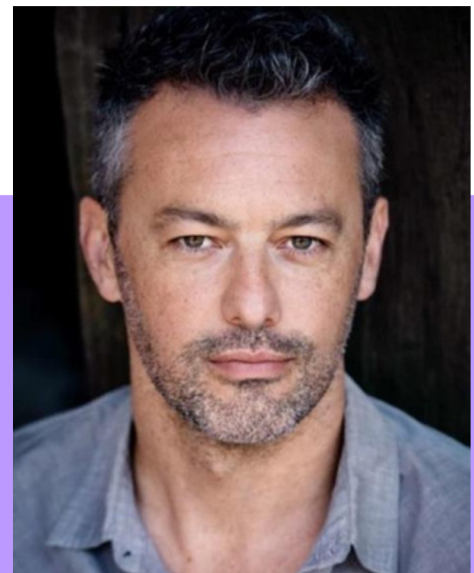

WEEK	ACTIVITY	LEARNING OUTCOME
1-3	Acting exercises and theatre games	Exercises and theatre games are used to explore and begin working on the fundamentals of acting. Connection, Listening, improvisation, focus, commitment, voice, and physicality
4-5	A/B scene	A/B scenes or generic scenes begin the process of learning the importance of information in a scene. It puts the focus not on 'what' is being said but 'why' it is being said.
6-10	Acting on camera	Participants will explore how to bring a performance "down", so it is appropriate for film while still being full of life and energy.
11-12	Film self-tapes	Each participant will film a 1-2 minute self-tape scene.
2 week break		
13-20	Theatre scene rehearsal	Participants will rehearse two hand theatre scenes, preparing for the week 25 live performance.
20	Showcase performance	The live performance will consist of each participant performing their live theatre scene as well as a screening of their self-tape.

PROGRAM FEES

For 2025, the 20-week program fees are \$5,600 + \$300 admin fee (inc GST). Fees can be paid in full up front or for those paying via NDIS, we provide invoices in four instalments, every five weeks, as per the below.

- Participants who enrol and accepted into the program are enrolled for the full 20-week program.
- Actors Centre Australia is not an NDIS provider, however we allow participants to pay for the program using their NDIS.
- Invoices are provided at five-week intervals requiring payment to continue the course. Please note that any invoice that is not paid by the due date will incur a 2% fee per day until the invoice is paid.
- All invoices will need to be paid in order for participants to participate and attend the final Showcase performance.

READY TO ENROL?

STEP ONE

Apply via the online application on the ACA website, and pay a \$300 deposit. 20 spots available.

STEP TWO

All new participants complete a phone conversation with our Support and Engagement Manager or senior support worker.

STEP THREE

Spots are finalised and participants are advised of further program details. Remember your enrolment is for the entire 20-week program.

STEP FOUR

Prepare for your first day! We want to make sure you are all set and ready to go on your first day. Things you'll need for your program: pen or pencil, notebook, water bottle, closed toe shoes, comfortable clothes, snacks and dinner for break time.
